Facts & figures on the renovation 2008-2013

GENERAL

Archaeological excavations since August 2007

Construction Start November 2008

Completion and Opening April 2013

More than 600 people involved in the project

On average 200-250 people per day on the construction site (peak day up to 500 people)

Around 140 companies involved in carrying out the work

Around 30 expert planners and consulting companies involved

PRESERVATION OF MONUMENTS/ RESTORATION

Approx. 150,000 sheets of gold leaf with a total weight of around 1.5 kg

Around 54,000 working hours spent on restoring the gilding

Restoration and repair of around 880 m² of inlaid parquet flooring and 1,850 m² of panel parquet

Restoration of 4 large bronze chandeliers and 20 crystal chandeliers

Stocking the chandeliers with 1,200 LED candles

CONSTRUCTION & ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING

Approx. 9,000 m³ building rubble

Approx. 13,000 m³ excavated material

Approx. 682,000 kg reinforced steel

Approx. 5,650 m³ concrete

Approx. 2,780 m² new slate roofing

Around 470,000 m electric cable

Lighting: approx. 80% converted to LED lighting

HEATING/ CLIMATE/VENTILATION/ SANITATION

Heating pipes approx. 13,000 m

Cooling pipes approx. 8,240 m

Sanitation pipes approx. 3,000 m

Sewage pipes approx. 4,000 m

Around 130 radiators

Around 525 m² underfloor heating
